

# O'Brien Creek Outfitters Equipment/Gear Checklist

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## Licenses

- Hunting license (please bring a picture ID)
- Conservation stamp (can be purchased locally when you arrive)
- Hunter safety card (Born after Jan 1<sup>st</sup>, 1996)

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## Clothing

Camo is not required, however, we strongly recommend it

- Underwear and socks: 1 pair per day
- Base layer/long underwear: at least 2 pairs
- Light weight jacket
- Wind layer
- Midweight jacket
- Heavy weight sweater or hoody
- Light weight shirt: 3-5 shirts
- Light weight pants: 1-2 pairs
- Mid weight pants: 1 pair
- Rain gear
- Light weight gloves: 2 pair
- Heavy weight gloves: 1 pair
- Hat and/or stocking cap
- Gaiters
- Waterproof hunting boots (please bring boots that have been broke in)
- Fluorescent orange article (Items such as a vest, hat, or sweater would work)
- Casual clothes and shoes

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## Personal Items

- Lip balm
- Bug spray
- Sunscreen
- Moleskin or blister kit
- Prescription/over the counter medications
- Duct tape
- Glasses or contact: extra pair recommended
- Sunglasses
- Personal toiletries
- Camera and extra batteries

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## Equipment

- Day pack (please no school backpacks)
- Binoculars
- Flashlight or headlamp with extra batteries
- Lighter/matches
- Pocket knife
- Water bottle

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## Weapon

### Rifle Hunters

WY Firearm Regulations: Chapter 32–Section 4

- Scoped rifle
- Ammo: 2 boxes
- Scope cover
- Rifle sling
- Soft rifle case

### Bow Hunters

WY Archery Regulations: Chapter 32–Section 6

- Bow (please be familiar with WY regulations for legal size and draw weight)
- Arrows: at least 1 dozen
- Broadheads (please be familiar with WY regulations for legality)
- Release
- Hard case
